# SUMMER CUB ADVENTURE

## Parent/Leader Guide

The 8 Districts of East Carolina Council and the Boy Scouts of America are excited to offer to the Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts a Summer Adventure to be held at Camp Hannah Bonner located near Camp Bonner North, near Washington N.C. The adventure will offer 3 weekends for Cub Scouts (May 18-20, June 15-17 and June 29-July 1) and 1 weekend for Webelos I Scouts (June 1-3).

As an Achievement oriented experience, these 2 night adventures will be open for Cubs to begin their Wolf and Bear advancement, while new Webelos I work on their Activities Pins and Boy Scout knowledge.

Leaders for each Den of Cubs and Patrols of Webelos have been recruited from the Districts responsible for each weekend. These leaders are committed to providing a “hands-on” interactive camping experience for those in attendance.

Either a parent or guardian that is at least 21 years of age must accompany each Cub and Webelos in attendance. The Scout and his partner are expected to be familiar with this guide and the rules when they arrive for their adventure. No siblings under age 6 will be permitted to attend.

The Summer Adventure stresses Cub Scout guidelines and Guide for Safe scouting. Some of those highlighted rules are provided below:

1. Automobiles allowed in designated areas only.
2. No Scouts are permitted to ride in open vehicles (ex: rear of pickup truck).
3. All youths must be seat belted when transported on Camp property.
4. Smoking in designated areas only. Smokers are responsible for making sure their Scouts had adequate supervision.
5. NO alcohol allowed!
6. No cooking in campsites. Please do not bring fast food to the dining hall.
7. Class “B” uniforms (Camp T-Shirt or other Scout T-Shirts) for all camp activities except Campfire and Chapel Service where Class “A” is required (full Scout Uniform). Closed in shoes required at all times.
8. No running or yelling in campsites.
9. Quiet time in campsites is from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am.
10. Tenting Guidelines – Adults may sleep in same tent with their son only.
11. Please use the trash receptacles provided.
12. Report any problems to the Camp Staff for immediate action!

## **Cost for Summer Cub Adventure**

Cost for the Summer Adventure is \$80.00 for each Scout and their Partner (2 individuals). This includes a patch and a T-Shirt for both, insurance, and all Activities.

## **Things You Need to Know About SUMMER CUB ADVENTURE:**

- A. Registration deadline is April 20, 2007, for all weekends. After April 20, the registration fee is \$95. No registrations accepted until January 1, 2007.
  - B. Registration and Health History Forms are included in this guide.
  - C. Plan to arrive at camp between 6:00 pm and 8:00 pm. Arrivals before or after will disrupt planned activities.
  - D. The following meals are provided:
    - Friday Evening – None, bring a bag lunch from home or eat before arrival.
    - Saturday – Breakfast, Lunch and Supper
    - Sunday – Breakfast
  - E. Trading Post will be on site with Scout items, snacks, soft drinks and bottled water for sale.
  - F. Showers are available. PLEASE abide by posted times for youth, male, and female use.
  - G. Each Scout will be provided with a passport to record his achievements at camp.
  - H. Each Scout will be provided a “Loot Bag” to carry his “stuff” from area to area.
  - I. There will be a campfire on Saturday night and Worship Service on Sunday Morning. Field uniform shirt required.
  - J. Patches will be awarded at Check Out on Sunday after your campsite has been inspected and passed.
- First Aid, medications at camp:
- 1 Medication must be in original bottle labeled with the Scout’s name, medication name, and dosage.
  - 2 All medication will be stored in a locked box in the Health Lodge.
  - 3 The Adult partner is responsible for bringing the Scout to the Health Lodge at the appropriate time and administering the medication in the appropriate way.
  - J. A volunteer Doctor, Nurse or Paramedic for MINOR First Aid will staff the Health Lodge. Anything more will be referred to the nearest hospital.

## **Directions to Camp Hannah Bonner:**

**From South: Highway 17 North to Washington, NC; turn right on to Highway 264 East / Highway 92. Bear right on to Highway 32 at the flashing light at Douglas Crossroads, Bunyan Fire Department will be on the left. Continue on Highway 32 past the Broad Creek EMS station on the left; at the next road to the left past the EMS station, turn left, that is Pamlico Plant Road. Continue on this road, look for the Summer Cub Adventure sign on the right--turn right down the dirt road and you are here!**

**From North: Highway 17 South to Washington, NC; turn left on to Highway 264 East/92. Turn right on to Highway 32 at Douglas Crossroads. After this right turn, Bunyan Fire Department will be on the left. Continue on Highway 32 past the Broad Creek EMS station on the left; at the next road to the left past the EMS Station, turn left, that is Pamlico Plant Road. Continue on this road, look for the Summer Cub Adventure sign on the right--turn right down the dirt road and you are here!**

**You should receive a confirmation letter within 2 weeks of your registration being received at the Scout Office. If you do not receive a letter, please contact Marsha via phone or email!**

## **REFUND POLICY**

**All refund requests must be in writing and mailed to the East Carolina Council Office. Refunds will be handled in the following manner:**

**Requests received prior to April 20-- all fees minus \$20 will be returned if that slot can be filled by another scout.**

**Requests received prior to May 18-- all fees minus \$50 will be returned if that slot can be filled by another scout.**

**Requests for refunds and/or "no shows" on/after May 18 will not be honored.**

## **WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP:**

- 1 Tent, Poles, Stakes (as needed)
- 2 Ground Cloth
- 3 Sleeping Bag, Pillow, and Air Mattress or Pad
- 4 Flashlight
- 5 Lantern
- 6 Rain Gear, swim suit
- 7 Field Uniform Shirt
- 8 Class "B" Uniform (Camp or other Scout T-Shirts)
- 9 Sturdy Shoes (No sandals or Flip Flops except for in the shower)
- 10 Personal hygiene items
- 11 Toothpaste, Toothbrush, and Soap
- 12 Towels and Washcloths for shower and Comb
- 13 Potato Peeler
- 14 Paring Knife (ONLY for the Adult Partner)
- 15 Pocket knives-must have Whittlin Chip
- 16 Sunscreen (Pump or Lotion)
- 17 Insect Repellant (Pump or Lotion)
- 18 Camp Chair that the Scout can carry from one area to another
- 19 Hat or Cap
- 20 CUB SCOUT ATTITUDE

NOTE: Please do not pack or carry any aerosol cans

## **THINGS TO LEAVE AT HOME:**

- 1 Radios, Televisions
- 2 Electronic Games
- 3 Matches or Fire Starters
- 4 Hunting Knives
- 5 Axes
- 6 Aerosol Cans

## CAMP HANNAH BONNER EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

In the event of a camp emergency, notify the Camp Director, Program Director, Camp Ranger and/or the Camp Medical Officer immediately. Where an emergency involving a camper is concerned, the appropriate Unit Leader (in camp) should be contacted.

NOTE: Emergency Phone Numbers are posted at each phone location.

### Camp Emergency Action Plan

With the exception of a Weather Emergency, all campers are to report immediately to their campsite upon hearing an emergency signal. In the case of a Weather Emergency, campers should seek protective shelter in the nearest ravine. Once the Weather Emergency has passed, campers should report to their campsites. Campers should remain in their campsites until the "All Clear" signal has been given. (*Leaders should review these procedures with their campers.*)

The following emergency signals will be used:

<b>Fire Alarm</b>	Three (3) blasts of a car or air horn throughout camp
<b>Weather Emergency</b>	Whistle blast throughout camp
<b>All Clear</b>	Will be announced by Camp Director
<b>Health Emergency</b>	Camp Health Officer will respond to all Health Emergency Situations

NOTE: Full descriptions of what to do for any of the above situations are listed below. Being informed is being aware!

### Intrusion of Unauthorized Persons

In the event of an intrusion by hostile, aggressive or unauthorized persons upon camp property, the following actions should be taken:

**Each Scout/Partner will be prepared by understanding the following:**

1. A plan to evacuate the campsite by the safest route possible will be discussed at the leaders meeting. All campers should gather a safe distance from the campsite.
2. AT NO TIME should an adult or youth camper approach or confront any unauthorized intruder.
3. An adult partner will notify the Camp Director or Camp Ranger of the intrusion. DO NOT send a youth camper to make this notification.
4. The Camp Management staff will notify the Beaufort County Sheriffs Department by the fastest means possible.

### **Camp Staff Responsibilities:**

1. The staff member will notify the Camp Director, Camp Program Director, Camp Ranger, or Camp Commissioner.
2. The Camp Staff will alert the Camp Director to stand by the telephone should Police or Medical Assistance be needed and contact the Beaufort County Sheriffs Department at 911 if required.
3. The Camp Director, Program Director, and/or Camp Ranger will go to the campsite or location of the intruder and attempt to deflect the aggressive action in a non-combative but authoritative manner.
4. Should the police be needed, the Camp Director will call them and then direct the staff in evacuating campers out of the neighboring campsites, help contain the aggressor(s), or assist the Camp Staff in their attempt to stop any actions dangerous to the campers.
5. **AT NO TIME** will a camper be allowed to be taken from any camp location by an intruder. All efforts to remove a camper will be stopped in any manner necessary.
6. Full reports will be forwarded to the East Carolina Council and to the nearest police agency with detailed descriptions of all intruders and actions taken.

Review of these procedures will be covered during camp staff training and outlined for all leaders at the opening night leaders briefing.

### **Missing Person**

The Fire Alarm will be sounded and Camp Staff will visit each campsite to assist with a roll call. If necessary, the staff will conduct a coordinated search of the camp area.

### **Fire**

The Fire Alarm will be sounded. Camp Staff will report to the dining hall to load fire-fighting equipment.

The Fireguard plan will be in effect. Each campsite will appoint a Fireguard to maintain fire equipment in the campsite. Instruction will be given on the Campsite Fireguard plan.

### **Weather Emergency**

The Camp Director or Camp Ranger will sound the alarm. All staff will report to the Dining Hall. In the event of a tornado, campers should seek protective cover in the nearest ravine. At the conclusion of the emergency, the camp staff will survey each campsite and work crews will be assigned to clean up any debris.

## **Earthquake**

The Fire Alarm will be sounded. The staff will be responsible for checking the property for damage and for ensuring the safety of the campers.

## **Health Emergencies**

In the event of a health emergency, the Health Officer will be responsible for taking all necessary actions and precautions.

## **Serious Injury or Fatality**

If a serious injury or fatality occurs, the Camp Director will be the first person notified who will then notify the Scout Executive. The Scout Executive or designated representative makes arrangements for personal visit with the parents of the injured or deceased.

## REGISTRATION/HEALTH HISTORY FORM

Summer Cub Adventure Camp is a 2-night campout held at Camp Hannah Bonner near the Council Camporee site in Washington, N. C. Adventure Camp offers an achievement-based experience for Cubs and Webelos I and the parent/guardian that accompanies him to camp. Each weekend is limited to 32 Scouts; deadline for registration is April 20, 2007.

The registration fee is \$80; that covers both the Scout and his partner. Late fee is \$95. The Scout should register at the rank he will be when school begins in the Fall, 2007, i.e., if your Scout is a Wolf now, he should attend camp as a Bear.
