Running a District Event: Budgeting, patches, and other components of running a Camporee or other event

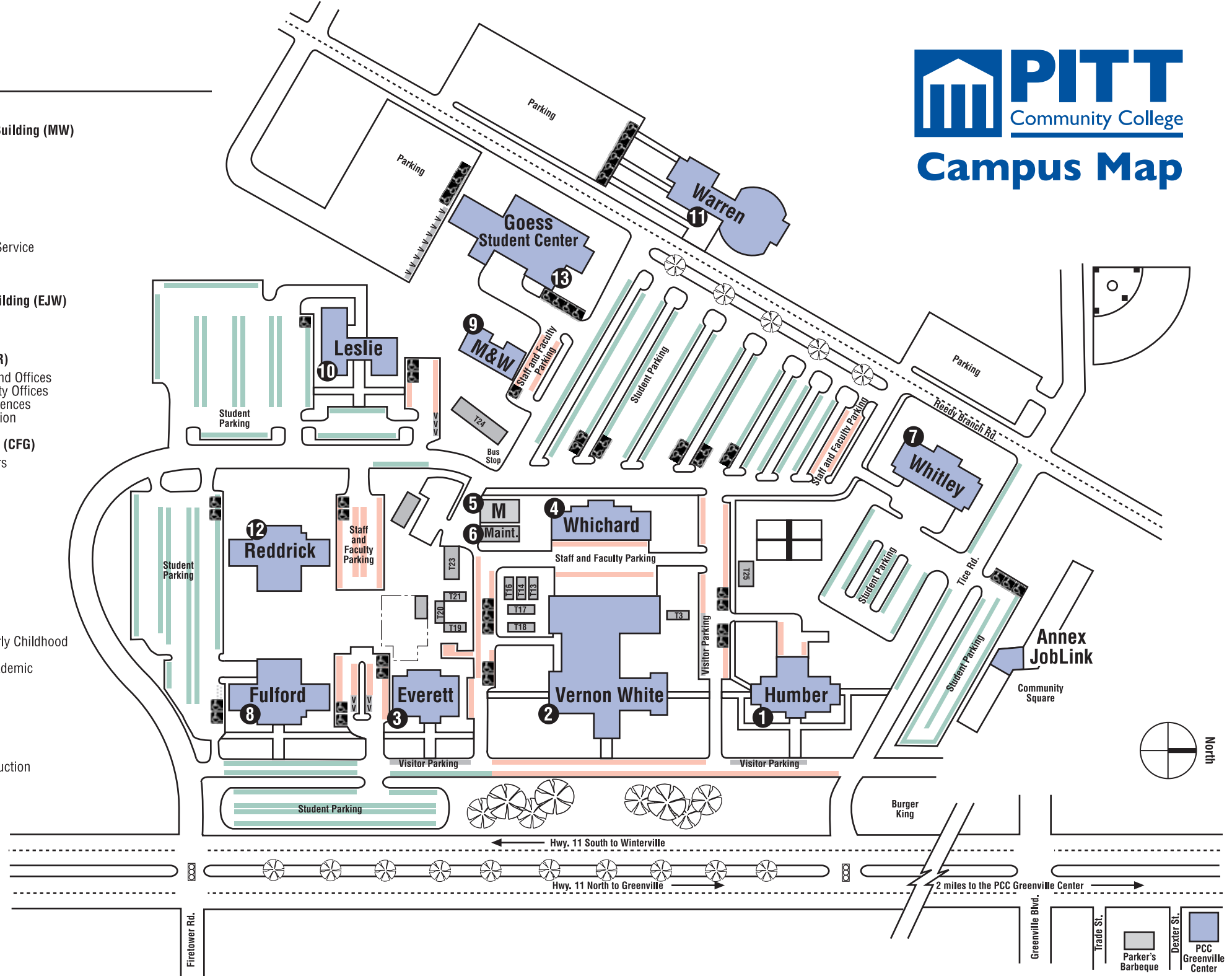
