Plan now to participate in the 2008 Scouting for Food effort!

The Scouting for Food Good Turn makes a difference for thousands of people in our communities.

In 2007 more than 100,000 pounds of food was gathered and delivered to local food pantries. The 2008 program will feature changes from previous years including:

- Use of a paper door hanger rather than a plastic bag
- Recognition streamer for each unit that participates in the effort and logs their service hours onto the Good Turn for America website (patches will not be provided)

These changes are due in part to the loss of a sponsor that provided funding for bags and patches.

These changes are also in response to feedback we have received regarding bags on the ground in neighborhoods, a desire to be more eco-friendly (utilizing door hangers made from recycled paper) and recognizing units that participate and log their service hours onto the Good Turn for America website at www.goodturnforamerica.org

Door hangers will be available at January Roundtables for distribution.
