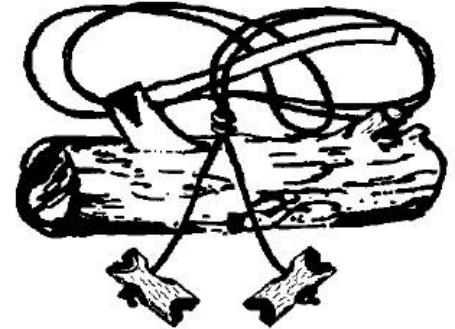

### Wood Badge has Four Specific Objectives:

- View scouting globally, as a family of interrelated, values-based programs that provide age-appropriate activities for youth
- Recognize the contemporary leadership concepts utilized in corporate America and leading government organizations that are relevant to our values-based movement.
- Apply the skills you learn from your participation as a member of a successful working team.
- Revitalize your commitment by sharing in an overall inspirational experience that helps provide Scouting with the leadership it needs to accomplish in its mission on an ongoing basis.

## S7-426-16 INFORMATION

Wood Badge Course S7-426-16 is hosted by the East Carolina Council. This course will be conducted over two weekends. Participants should understand that their arrival time will be at 7:00 AM Friday of the 1st weekend and Saturday of the 2nd weekend. Departure time on the Sunday of the first weekend will be approximately 6:00 PM. The second weekend concludes on Monday at 5:00 PM.

### WHAT IS WOOD BADGE?

The Wood Badge leadership training experience will consist of two weekends. During the first weekend, participants will be divided into groups that will operate as a patrol throughout the Wood Badge Course. Dining and sleeping accommodations will be provided (bring your own sleeping gear). The second weekend will involve an outdoor experience for participants where patrols provide for their own shelter and meals.

### WHO MAY ATTEND

Wood Badge is open to all scouting programs, i.e. Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, and Venturing.

### UNIFORMS

The uniform that you wear in your normal Scouting position will be the uniform that you will wear at Wood Badge. This uniform must include: official BSA shirt, trousers, web belt, socks and shoulder loops commensurate with your Scouting position.

## PREREQUISITE TRAINING

To qualify to attend Wood Badge, a participant must have completed the basic training specific to their scouting position:

### *Scouting's Basic Leader Training Courses*

- *New Leaders Essentials—All adult leaders*

### *Leader specific training for:*

- *Den Leaders*
- *Cubmasters*
- *Webelos leaders*
- *Tiger Cub leaders*
- *Pack committee members*
- *Troop committee members*
- *Scoutmasters and assistant Scoutmasters*
- *Varsity Scout Coaches and assistant Coaches*  
*(Previous versions of leader training courses are acceptable prerequisites)*

### *Scouting Outdoor Skills Training*

- *Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills*  
*(required for all Scoutmasters, assistant Scoutmasters, Varsity Coaches and assistant Varsity Coaches)*

*All other participants are **encouraged** to complete the Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills course training before attending a Wood Badge for the <sup>st</sup> 21 Century course.*

### PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

A personal equipment checklist will be provided to you shortly after you register. You will be responsible for providing your basic camping gear such as sleeping bag (both weekends) and a tent for the outdoor experience on the second weekend.



### FEES

The course fee is \$200.00 which covers food for the first weekend, liability and medical insurance, training materials, supplies, and training recognition.

### FINANCIAL AID

It is suggested that your unit or charter institution consider either full or partial assistance with course fees and expenses. This vital training will immeasurably enhance the resources available to your Scouting program and service to the youth of your community.
