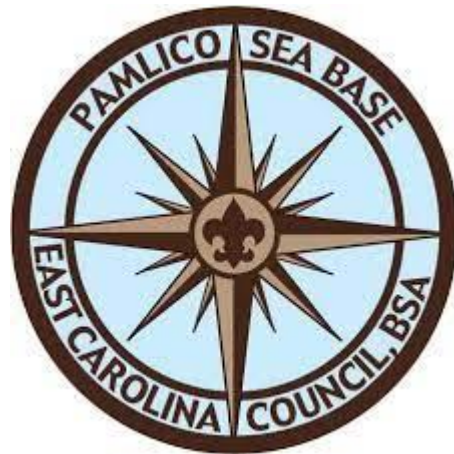

### General Information

1. The intent of Sea Scout and Venturing Officer Association (SSVOA) events is to promote Sea Scouting and Venturing and Explorers by providing programming for young adults. All registered Venturer, Sea Scout, Explorer, or older Scouts BSA (who are 14, or 13 and completed the 8<sup>th</sup> grade) are invited to attend and are encouraged to consider dual registration in a Ship, Crew, or Post.
2. All scouts should adhere to the Scout Oath and Scout Law as the rules governing their behavior on camp property
3. Make sure parents/guardians know the crew/ship number, and the name of the unit leader(s) in attendance.
4. The use of mind-altering substances to include alcoholic beverages by adult or youth members will result in the immediate dismissal from the event site. Parents will be notified to come pick up their scout.
5. Smoking/Vaping is only allowed in the main parking lot at Camp Boddie. Smoking in the bathrooms, on trails, or in campsites is prohibited.
6. Showing of Affection- This is a scouting event, and it is understood that we are dealing with young adults who may become romantically involved with each other. Youth and adults should refrain from signs of affection such as kissing, hugging, holding hands or sitting on top of each other and other inappropriate behavior that may make others uncomfortable. No public displays of affection.
7. **DO NOT DRIVE OR PARK ON THE GRASS!** Vehicles may be parked near camp sites to unload but then must be parked in designated parking areas. Special exceptions for medical reasons can be made with prior approval from event staff.
8. All ships and crews will be required to have **2** registered adult leaders in attendance. If there are females in the unit, one leader **must** be registered who is female and YPT trained. All adult leaders will camp with their crews/ships. If a unit is unable to provide qualified adult leadership, they may buddy-up with another unit. This should be coordinated with event staff prior to arriving at the event.
9. Venturing Crews, Explorer Posts, Sea Scout Ships, and STEM scouts are encouraged to attend and participate in all events.
10. All scouts will remain on the Sea Base area/shooting sports area throughout the event. If there are compelling reasons or emergencies for leaving, permission must be secured through unit leader and SSVOA leadership.

11. Scouts should use the buddy system when outside camp areas. The buddy system will require 2 of the same sex. 2 males and 1 female, or 1 male and 2 females is allowed when mixing sexes for a group of 3. Groups may be larger than this if YPT rules are followed
12. During the events on Saturday, an activity uniform may be worn. Scouts should dress “clean & appropriate” in a unit activity uniform. Shoes should be sneaker type boots, or leather shoes. For safety reasons NO sandals or open-toed shoes will be allowed. **NO CROCS** on the range.
13. Shorts should be school appropriate length. No tank tops of any type for males and females. Shirts should be modest.
14. All meals will be hosted by Ship 1117. There will be no need for units to cook on their own. An area will be designated for the Saturday evening Dutch oven dessert contest.
15. Please set up campsites with Leave No Trace and Tread Lightly principles in mind.
16. Approved lanterns may be used in campsites. Only electric lanterns or flashlights are to be used outside the unit’s site. Generators will not be permitted on the grounds for units without council executive approval.
17. Swimming in the Pamlico River is strictly **FORBIDDEN** by Scouts and adults. This includes **WADING** in the river.
18. Units are encouraged to bring unit flags and burgees to mark unit sites.
19. Personal or unit watercraft will not be used during the event period without prior approval and coordination.
20. The national flag will be hoisted and lowered at a formal ceremony on Saturday and Sunday. Field uniforms are to be worn and tucked in appropriately.
21. Council Event Insurance covers accidents only and has a deductible. This does NOT cover normal sickness.
22. All persons/guest are required to register at the Camp Office located in Area HQ (Kennedy Center located at Sea Base.)

**Fee Refund Policy:** All refund requests must be made in writing and mailed to the East Carolina Council Office. Any requests for refunds on ‘no shows’ will not be honored. Refund requests for Scouts or Parents that depart early from camp will not be honored.

**Medical Forms:** All Camporee participants are required to complete and submit an Annual Health and Medical form. Event staff may ask units to see the Medical Forms and retain the right to remove a unit from camp if forms are not complete. This is the new A&B form on the newly released medical form. (A doctor’s signature is not required for this event). The Medical form can be found on the East Carolina Council website under “BSA Forms”.

**Flags:** Each Unit is requested to bring their Unit Flag to the Event and display them in their campsites. We ask that you also bring your unit flags to the Flag Ceremony on Saturday morning.

**Uniforms:** Scouts should wear their Field Uniform to morning and evening meals and formations. Scouting T-shirts, Activity Uniform, are to be worn for activities throughout Saturday.

Since Sea Scouting and Venturing are youth-led programs, it is essential that our leadership structure above the unit is youth-inspired and youth-led. We believe that youth should organize program events, lead entertaining trainings, and provide forums to bring the crews, districts, councils, and areas together. The Council Sea Scout and Venturing Officers' Association, or SSVOA, consists of a team of youth officers who are supported by advisors. It provides leadership opportunities that prepare young people for their respective futures and gives them a voice to help strengthen the Venturing program.

The Sea Scout and Venturing Officers' Association (SSVOA) will provide opportunities for adventure, leadership, personal growth, and service (ALPS). By doing so, they serve to model best practices in programming for local ships and crews and to provide a program resource for Sea Scouts, Venturers and Advisors throughout the Council.

The purpose of SSVOA is not to hold meetings, but to provide fun and informative program opportunities for Sea Scouts and Venturers. In many ways, the SSVOA serves as a forum for planning and carrying out great program. The SSVOA officers and advisors know they have done their job well when they see that the efforts of the SSVOA have served to strengthen the Venturing program in their area of operation.

The Council SSVOA will meet virtually on the last Tuesday of each month and will hold a Quarterly Face to Face event. The fall meeting will be held at this event during the Saturday evening meal. All Council Sea Scout and Venturing Youth Leaders and Advisors are encouraged to attend this meeting. A meeting agenda will be provided at Friday evening's check in.

## Scoring

This is placed so that everyone is aware how the participants will be scored by NRA Range Safety Officers.

## Age Groups

14-16	17-19	20+
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## Shotgun

There will be 10 shots total. 5 will be warm up shots and 5 will be scored. There will be 5 points rewarded per clay. So, a total of 25 is possible.

## Rifle/Pistole

There will be 10 shots total. 5 will be warm up shots and 5 will be scored. A group of 5 under 1 quarter is 25 points. A total of 25 points is possible.

## Archery (Genesis Bows)

There will be no practice shots. 10 shots will be scored from 1-10 points depending on where the target is hit. A total of 100 points is possible.

## Tomahawk Throw

5 throws total. 1 point awarded for one that hits the target but doesn't stick. 2 points awarded for one that hits and sticks. For a total of 10 points possible.

## Extra Competition

For \$5, to be paid the day of the event in cash, a scout can earn the honor of having their name put on a Black Pearl Trophy that will stay at Sea Base.
